

MATERIAL	MATERIAL DEFINITION
<p>Lead-acid Batteries</p> 	<p>Lead-acid batteries used in motor vehicles or stationary applications.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>NOT ACCEPTED!</b></p>
<p>Leaves and Yard Waste</p> 	<p>Deciduous and coniferous leaves, grass clippings, garden materials, shrub trimmings, and brush up to one inch in diameter.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Dispose of in present Yard Waste Area.</b></p>
<p>Whole Tires (landfills only)</p> 	<p>Whole car and truck tires of all types. A tire can be landfilled only if it has been shredded or ground into at least four pieces so that it no longer has a circular shape. Combustion facilities and transfer stations can accept whole tires.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Annual Collection - Check Website for Notice!</b></p>
<p>White Goods</p> 	<p>An appliance employing electricity, oil, natural gas, or liquefied petroleum gas to cook food, to wash or dry clothing, cooking or kitchen utensils or related items, or to heat air or water. These include dish washers, clothes washers and clothes dryers, gas or electric ranges and ovens, and hot water heaters. (310 CMR 19.006) hot water heaters.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Metal Box</b> <b>No Refrigerators, Freezers, or Air Conditioners!</b></p>
<p>Metal Containers Effective 4/20/2011</p> 	<p>Aluminum, steel or bi-metal beverage and food containers. <b>SEE NEW MATERIALS ACCEPTED FLYER!</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Co-mingled, Use Existing Recycling Box.</b></p>

<p>Glass Containers Effective date 4/1/93</p> 	<p>Glass bottles and jars excluding light bulbs, plate glass, ceramics, Pyrex cookware, drinking glasses, windows, and windshields.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Co-mingled, Use Existing Recycling Box.</b></p>
<p>Single Resin Narrow-necked Plastics Effective date 12/31/94</p> 	<p>All narrow-necked plastic containers of any resin type. In narrow-necked containers the diameter of the opening is smaller than the diameter of the base (e.g., soda bottle is "narrow-necked", but a yogurt container is not).</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Co-mingled, Use Existing Recycling Box.</b></p>
<p>Recyclable Paper Effective date 12/31/94</p> 	<p>All paper, cardboard, and paperboard products excluding tissue paper, toweling, paper plates, cups, and other low-grade paper products which become unusable to paper mills as a result of normal intended use (e.g., office paper, newspapers, unwaxed cardboard and cereal boxes, but not used paper towels).</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>No Pizza Boxes!</b></p>
<p>Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) Effective date 4/1/00</p> 	<p>Any intact, broken, or processed glass tube used to provide the visual display in televisions, computer monitors and certain scientific instruments such as oscilloscopes. (310 CMR 19.006)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Annual Collection - Check Website for Notice!</b></p>

**Footnotes:**

\* These items can be collected curbside April - October (Greenfield residents only). Requires pre-payment of fees above plus \$12/load pick-up fee. Call 772-1528 to schedule.

\*\* Non-household generators are charged \$10/load handling fee.

The Franklin County Solid Waste Management District encourages residents to dispose of household hazardous waste properly. The District operates several facilities in Franklin County where any District resident may bring common household hazardous waste items for disposal. The sites are open year-round and are located in Bernardston, Colrain, and Conway. These facilities are permitted to accept automotive products such as used motor oil, oil filters, transmission fluid, and anti-freeze; mercury-containing devices such as fluorescent lamps, button batteries, fever thermometers and thermostats; oil-based paints, thinners, lacquers, and other paint-related items; rechargeable nickel-cadmium batteries; and fluorescent lamp ballasts. Latex paint is non-hazardous and will not be accepted. Small [fees](#) ranging from \$1-\$5 will be charged for all items except mercury fever thermometers, thermostats, button batteries, and rechargeable batteries, for which there is no charge.

If you have questions about the disposal of specific household hazardous products at these regional sites, please call the District office at (413) 772-2438 to determine if the items are accepted.

If you have hazardous products that are not listed above or if you do not wish to pay the fees, the District sponsors an annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection. This collection is free to District residents and takes almost every other type of hazardous product. Businesses may participate in this annual collection by paying for the disposal costs associated with their wastes.
